**Niches** Space: Width 60cms x Depth 60cms x Height 80cms. Provide own backing if desired.  
**Open staging** Space: Width 60cms x Depth 60cms x Height optional unless otherwise stated.

Avoid using matching plates, pot covers etc which would identify the Exhibitor.

**HORTICULTURAL CLASSES**

**DAFFODILS AND NARCISSI**

Blooms in Classes 1-13 should be of one variety only.  
***Trumpet*** means having a cup as long or longer than the surrounding petals (commonly named Daffodils).  
***Large Cupped*** means having a cup more than one-third, but less than equal to, the length of the petals.  
***Small Cupped*** means having a cup not more than one-third the length of the surrounding petals.  
Keep blooms upright, facing forward, using oasis or paper for support, also group with the tallest at the back to give better presentation for judging.
